

otary Bangalore Lakeside, RID 3190, has been implementing a series of programmes related to enhancing the classroom experience for schoolchildren.

The club provided labrelated material, under their project 'Gift a lab - Science Lab in a Box', to benefit students of Classes 8 to 10 at the Karnataka Public (Government) School in Bengaluru. The syllabus covers over 200 Chemistry, Physics and Biology concepts recommended by teachers



from 2,000 schools across eight states. The kits, designed by the India Literacy Project, include experiment manuals and links for demonstration videos. "We want to extend this project to other government and government-aided schools in our district," says club president Kashi Prabhu.

The club is providing mathematics classes to students of government primary schools in rural areas in the district to improve their math skills and prepare them for competitive exams such as Olympiad.

A toilet restoration work was undertaken at the Government High School in Koira, Devanahalli taluk. Plumbing work, cleaning of the sump and overhead tank and facilitating water supply to the toilets were done.

Healthcare projects galore in Sivakasi
