### A village school gets a makeover

Furniture, computers, laptops, fans, LED lamps, water tanks, RO water purifier, four toilets with disabled-friendly ramps, new sewage and electrical lines, paver blocks, false ceilings, projectors, tile floors,

Around 300 girls had their blood grouping and blood tests done to know if they were anaemic or not. "All the girls from Classes 7 to 12 were given sanitary napkins, followed by an interactive session on menstrual health and hygiene. They were thought about sexual abuse, stalking and harassment by three doctors, and means to protect themselves in these situations," he said.

#### A different Diwali

Diwali was celebrated by donating festival kits containing dress material, groceries and sweets to differentlyabled which brought a smile on their faces. Club members sponsored the Diwali kits. Cloth bags with message 'Say no to plastic' were distributed to the public as part of awareness campaign against the hazardous use of plastics in daily life.

#### Cardiac check-up camp

At a mega heart-screening camp hosted jointly with Palani Babu Jewellers and Chettinad Super Specialty Hospital, 210 patients were examined by a panel of doctors following a series of tests for BP, blood sugar, body mass index and other parameters for healthy living.

PDG N Manimaran inaugurated the heart check-up camp which was presided over by club president Rajasekaran. Heart Camp district chair Palaniappan and headmaster A Muthukaruppan at the Ramasamy Chettiar Town Higher Secondary School, the camp venue, spoke on the occasion.

In his address, AG Deepak Kumar, camp coordinator, stressed on the importance of getting the heart examined once a year and called for lifestyle modifications for a healthy, disease-free life. Out of 200 patients registered, 150 were recommended for ECG and ECHO tests at the camp site. Further, 50 patients were asked to get "reviewed for angiogram and surgery at their convenience at the Chettinad Super Specialty Hospital."

A 20-member Rotary team worked for the smooth conduct of the medical camp. Also, district chairs Sakthivel, R S Ravichandran, AG Ravi, Past AGs Muthiah, Kamalchand, and district membership chair S R Ganesh were present at the venue. Students of the Government Nursing College, Cuddalore, and medicos from the Government Medical College took part as volunteers for the success of the cardiac camp. Club secretary Dr V Ravichandran gave the vote of thanks by noting the contributions of medical professionals in making the health camp a huge success.

Around 240 Rotarians and their family members watched Tamil film *Ponniyin Selvan*, a historical flick, with AG Deepak Kumar sponsoring the event through his Mishrimal Mahaveerchand Jain Trust. Some of the Lions members too joined to watch the movie at the local theatre.

#### **Installation projects**

During the installation of new office-bearers, Chidambaram MLA Rtn K A Pandian and Palani Babu Group proprietor P Palani donated sewing machines worth ₹90,000 to three women for them to earn regular income.

Goats were given to four deprived women from the club's adopted Mela Thirukazhi Paalai village; scholarships were presented to three girl students; and all the beneficiaries were also given vegetable and fruit-bearing saplings.

### Medical check-up & cleanliness drive in Ghaziabad

Under the project 'e-Clean India' the club in association with Attero, an e-waste recycling company, collected old air conditioners, LED TVs, refrigerators, desktops, laptops, printers, water coolers, DVD players and printers. They were handed over to Attero to be disposed of in a safe manner.


