Creating awareness on anaemia

A total of 400kg of jaggery and 75kg of bajra were contributed to the Dateri Gaushala as part of this initiative, ensuring the well-being of the animals under Project Cow Hara Chara Sewa.

World Polio Day

Around 100 schoolchildren and their parents took part in a special event on World Polio Day (Oct 24) at the government officers' complex. The event held in partnership with the Buddhas Martial Arts saw a presentation by Mohanraj who recalled the origins of Rotary's global fight against polio starting from the

development of first oral polio vaccine (OPV) by Dr Albert Sabin, an honorary member of RC Cincinnati, in 1961. Till that time, vaccine injections, developed by Dr Jonas Salk in 1955, are used against polio around the world.

At the RI convention in 1980, it was decided that priority should be given to the elimination of polio in the Philippines as the disease is endemic in this island country. Among the 32 countries in the West Pacific region, around 45 per cent of polio-inflicted people were living in the

Philippines then. Also, the mortality rate due to polio is 74 per cent at that time in this country.

A clean-up drive was taken up on the premises of Arulmigu Santharamman temple with club president Asokan leading the Rotarian volunteers. In a similar initiative, Asokan led a team of Rotarians and Rotaractors in a clean-up drive near the Anjaneya sanctum in the same temple. Pudukkottai Municipality chairman Thilagavathi Senthil and its vice-chairman Liyakat Ali Khan inaugurated the clean-up drive. ■
