Digital health centre inaugurated

Team Rotary News

The first ABHA ID (Ayushman Bharat Health Account) centre in Rajasthan was inaugurated at the District SDM Hospital with the support of RC Bikaner Royals, RID 3053, marking a step toward digital healthcare services and easier access to medical records for patients. The centre will help patients create ABHA IDs, enabling them to digitise health records, prescriptions, investigation reports, and treatment history for easier access and direct coordination with doctors.

The centre was inaugurated by Vishram Meena, the divisional commissioner of Bikaner, in the presence of hospital superintendent Dr Sunil Harsh and club president Sunil Chamadia. Meena appreciated the club and described

the project as “an important step toward digitalisation.”

Chamadia said the initiative was taken up after the hospital superintendent, Harsh, informed the club about the need for a dedicated ABHA facility at the hospital. Following this, the club members, including Vipin Laddha (club secretary) and senior members, approved and facilitated the project.

Project coordinator CS Nitesh Ranga said the centre is expected to reduce dependence on paper prescriptions and physical medical files, while helping patients avoid long queues and difficulties in managing medicine and investigation records. “With health data available online, the initiative is expected to improve convenience for patients and support more efficient healthcare services.” ■

Hundreds of people were screened at a mega eye check-up camp conducted by RC Katpadi, RID 3231, in partnership with the Indian Red Cross Society, Vellore, and CMC Eye Hospital.

The medical camp enhanced access to quality eyecare services and created awareness on eye health among the community, said DG V Suresh who was present at the venue. While the surgery cost is ₹2.5 lakh, the club's donation will lessen the burden on the family and

enable them to meet emergency spend on medicines. The cheque was handed over to the patient's mother through Dr Chokkalingam on behalf of the Katpadi club. ■

High-tech equipment for Asansol hospital

RID 3240 DG Kameswar Singh Elangbam inaugurated a number of high-tech diagnostic equipment at the Maa Sarada Charitable Dispensary, the maiden global grant project done by RC Asansol, RID 3240, valued at \$32,974. RC Turtle Creek Valley, RID 7305, US is the global partner.

With these high-tech devices, the charity hospital attached to the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama in Asansol, will be able to reach out to over 2,400 eyecare patients, including 600 new patients, who were referred to elsewhere; over 3,000 dental patients; and provide diagnostic services to more than 2,000 patients each year. The club's IPP Abhay Jayant laid the foundation for the GG project, along with past president

Silver jubilee celebrations with 25 service projects

The project worth ₹ 31 lakh was funded by M Anandan, founder, Aptus Value Housing Finance. The hospital's CMO Dr Thanikachalam, Dr Shiram, medical director, Wockhardt Foundation, and DG Vinod Saraogi were present at the handing over event of the medical devices at the hospital.

In another event, the club presented Anandan with Vocational Excellence Award for his professional achievement and commitment to social responsibility. In his acceptance speech, he shared Aptus' growth journey, highlighting its expansion to 350 branches, a workforce of 4,000 employees, and a customer base of over 200,000 across the country.

A cardiology camp was organised by the club, in association with the Apollo Specialty Hospitals, for elderly people residing in Asiana Shubham, a senior citizens community in Chennai.

A wide range of medical services was offered during the camp, including ECG, Echo, blood sugar testing, blood pressure

measurement, and height and weight assessment. Nearly 75 senior citizens benefitted from the free health screening conducted at the camp.

Following the diagnostic tests, the participants received specialised cardiology consultation from expert doctors along with a comprehensive medical guidance. ■

A music fundraiser for thalassaemia care

RC Ahmedabad Airport, RID 3055, marked its silver jubilee year with a healthcare-focused service initiative to support patients with thalassaemia through fundraising, raising awareness and medical assistance programmes.

As part of the initiative, the club organised a live bhajan concert by Anup Jalota in August 2025. The event raised ₹9.5 lakh, which was dedicated entirely to thalassaemia-related healthcare activities.

Using the funds generated through the concert, the club conducted thalassaemia and anaemia screening camps at several educational institutions in Ahmedabad, including St Xavier’s College, MP Shah College and Sadhu Vaswani School. More than 1,000 students were screened during the outreach programme that identified thalassaemia traits and anaemia at an early stage while also spreading awareness about preventive care.

The club also launched a Thala Pump Bank to support patients undergoing regular treatment for thalassaemia. The initiative provides iron chelation pumps, which are used to manage iron overload caused by repeated

blood transfusions, a common requirement for patients under treatment.

Club secretary Rushang Soni said, “The project was meant to combine community participation with long-term healthcare support. The initiative was carried out with support from educational institutions, donors and local community members.” ■
