A parliament-style RYLA for students in Haridwar

The Rotary Club of Hardwar, RID 3080, conducted a unique RYLA programme on the theme 'Government and parliamentary setup in India' at the Saraswati Vidya Mandir school. The programme was designed to give students a real-life understanding of the Indian democratic and parliamentary system through active participation and experiential learning.

All 1,900 students of the school were treated as the nation's electoral population, while each of the 40 sections of the school were treated as individual constituencies. Every

section elected six representatives, resulting in a 240-member 'School Parliament'.

The elected representatives then went through a democratic process to elect leaders among themselves for key responsibilities such as prime minister, deputy PM, defence minister, deputy defence minister, parliamentary minister, judiciary minister, and other important positions.

The democratic exercise was conducted over a month and included invitation of nominations, filing of candidature, withdrawal of nominations, election campaigning, voting

process, and counting and declaration of results.

The school is now continuing this elected parliamentary body as the student administrative body under the name 'Chatr Sansad'.

School principal Saini spoke with the students on how parliamentary democracy functions in India and the responsibilities attached to leadership. Club president Alope Saraswat spoke about Rotary, democratic values within the organisation, and the important role students can play in strengthening India's democratic system. ■

Egg pushcarts enhance livelihoods in the North East

The Rotary Clubs of Imphal and Polo City Imphal, RID 3240, gave egg carts to ten youngsters from less privileged families in Imphal. The pushcarts were distributed through the Rotary Egg Bank project founded in 2017 by Hari Kishan Valmiki, a member of RC Secunderabad, RID 3150 (For detailed story, refer *Rotary News*, June 2026). The project runs in partnership with the National Egg Coordination Committee (NECC).

Earlier Valmiki, in an effort to promote the egg carts in the North East, gifted them to 50 unemployed youth at Guwahati, with the support from Rotary clubs in Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura and Manipur.

Stoves, utensils, electric bulbs and stools were also given along with the push carts. The new vendors were taught 100 different kinds of egg recipes and they were given seed money of ₹16,000 to start the venture. Valmiki estimates that these vendors will be able to generate daily sales of around ₹10,000, of which their profit can be around ₹2,500–3000.

RC Imphal has been associated with the project since 2021, and over 1,000 children at various orphanages in Manipur had benefitted from it.

The egg carts were presented to the beneficiaries at the Rotary Bhavan by Arunkumar Singh, a Rotarian MLA. ■
